Program Policy

Payment must be made at the time of registration. If full payment cannot be made, then a 10% deposit must at least be made to hold the spot. The remainder of the payment must be made half way through program. Payment for ongoing programs such as KinderKubs and Afterschool must be completed by the first of each month.

Refund/Cancellations: No refunds will be given unless written notice of cancellation is received prior to the commencement of the second class. A charge of \$5 will be placed on all cancellations and NSF cheques. Kingsdale Neighbourhood Association reserves the right to cancel programs at any time due to insufficient registration.


